

DIY DJ Turntable

THE BIG IDEA:

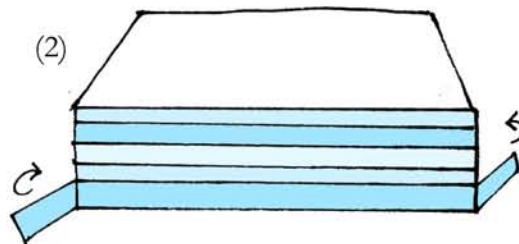
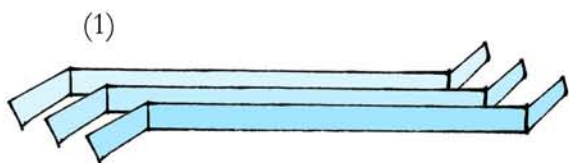
You are going to create a DJ turntable and headphones! Get your supplies in order and turn up the music!

WHAT YOU NEED:

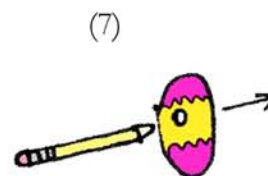
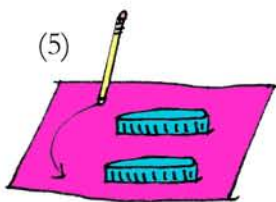
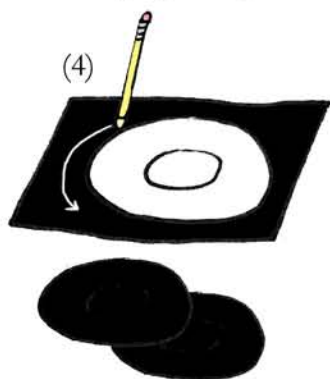
_glue	_pipe cleaners	_2 peanut butter jar lids	_pencil
_scissors	_construction paper	_a headband	_ruler
_tape	_2 paper plates	_3 plastic bottle caps	
_a cardboard box	_ribbon	_color markers	

THE BREAKDOWN:

1. Use a ruler to draw a straight line and cut paper in to 3" thick strips.
2. Tape or glue the strips together so they are long enough to cover the front of your box. Cut as many strips as you need.
3. Tape or glue the strips to the front of your box to create a striped pattern of color.



4. Use a paper plate to trace two circles on black construction paper. Cut out the circles.
5. Use the peanut butter jar lids to trace two small circles on colored paper. Cut circles.
6. Name and decorate your record label. Center the label on the black record and glue in place.
7. Using a pencil poke a hole in the center of the record.

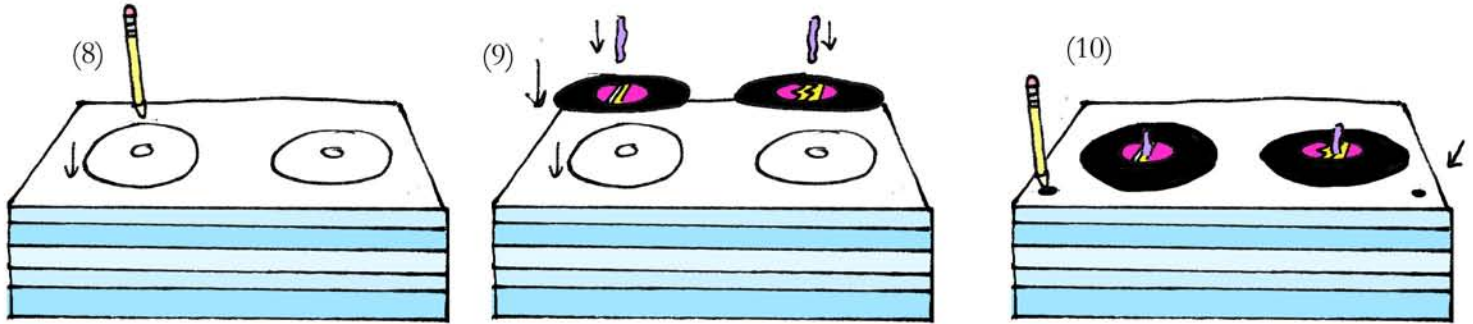


THE BREAKDOWN:

8. Flip both plates and glue them to the lid of your box. Let dry. Using a pencil poke a hole in the center of the plates. Place your record on top of the plates to line up the holes.

9. Cut a 1” piece of pipe cleaner and plug it in the hole to keep the records in place.

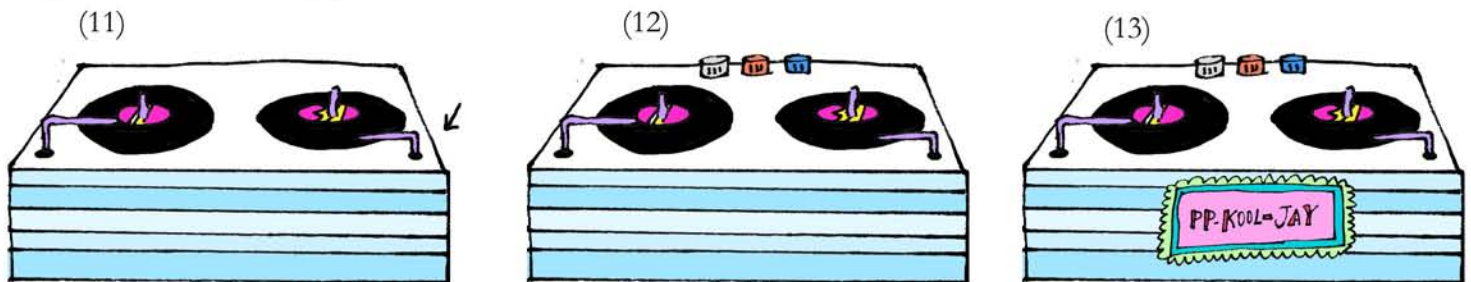
10. Using your pencil poke two holes in the top right and left corners of your box lid.



11. Use a pipe cleaner to make record needles. Bend into an “L” shape. Poke the short end of the “L” into the box - the other end should rest on top of your record. Repeat on the other side.

12. Glue plastic bottle caps to the lid of your box. These are your volume knobs.

13. Create your own unique DJ name (Penny went with “PP Kool Jay”) and decorate your sign with markers and pipe cleaners.



14. HEADPHONES: Using a headband, tape or glue the peanut butter jar lids to the head band. Repeat both sides and let dry. Cut a long piece of ribbon (approx. 24”) and tape one end and to your headphones and the other end to your turntable to act as your cord.

15. Get the party started.
